Renewable Energy

Sustainable transition away from fossil fuels will need to be USD110trn of investment in renewable energies cumulatively to 2050.¹

HGIF Global Equity Climate Change – Monthly Commentary

At sector level, stock selection was negative for the month. Positive performance came from Materials and Health Care, though this was offset by negative stock selection in Industrials and Information Technology.

At country level, stock selection was negative for the month. Positive performance came from Korea and Taiwan, though this was offset by negative stock selection in USA and United Kingdom.

USA Industrials security, CORE & MAIN INC-CLASS A with total effect 0.14% is the top contributor. Additionally, Mainland China Consumer Discretionary security, BYD CO LTD-H was the second largest contributor with total effect 0.14%. Mainland China Industrials security, CIMC ENRIC HOLDINGS LTD also contributed with total effect 0.12%.

On the other side, detractors included United Kingdom Industrials security ASSTEAD GROUP PLC with total effect -0.49%, USA Industrials holding, TRANE TECHNOLOGIES PLC with total effect -0.49%, and USA Information Technology holding, BROADCOM INC with total effect -0.41%.

During this period, no positions were opened. Positions were closed in VEOLIA ENVIRONNEMENT.

Sector and Country allocation effects are residual to stock selection. At a country level, effects were positive, given an overweight exposure to Mainland China. At sector level, effects were negative, given an underweight exposure to Industrials.

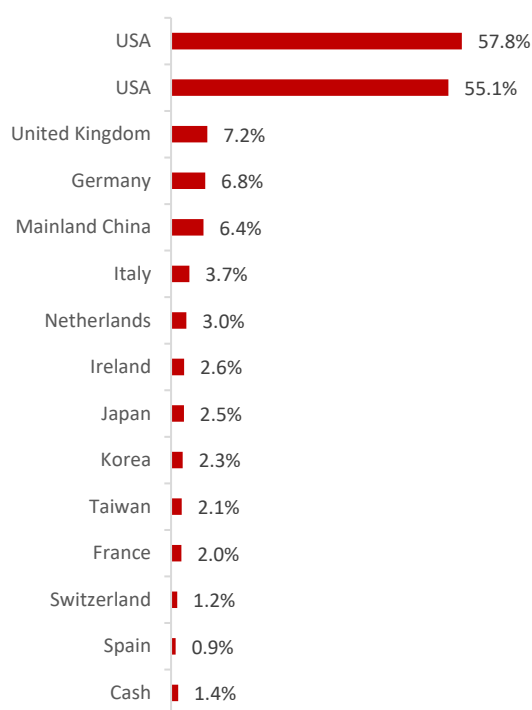

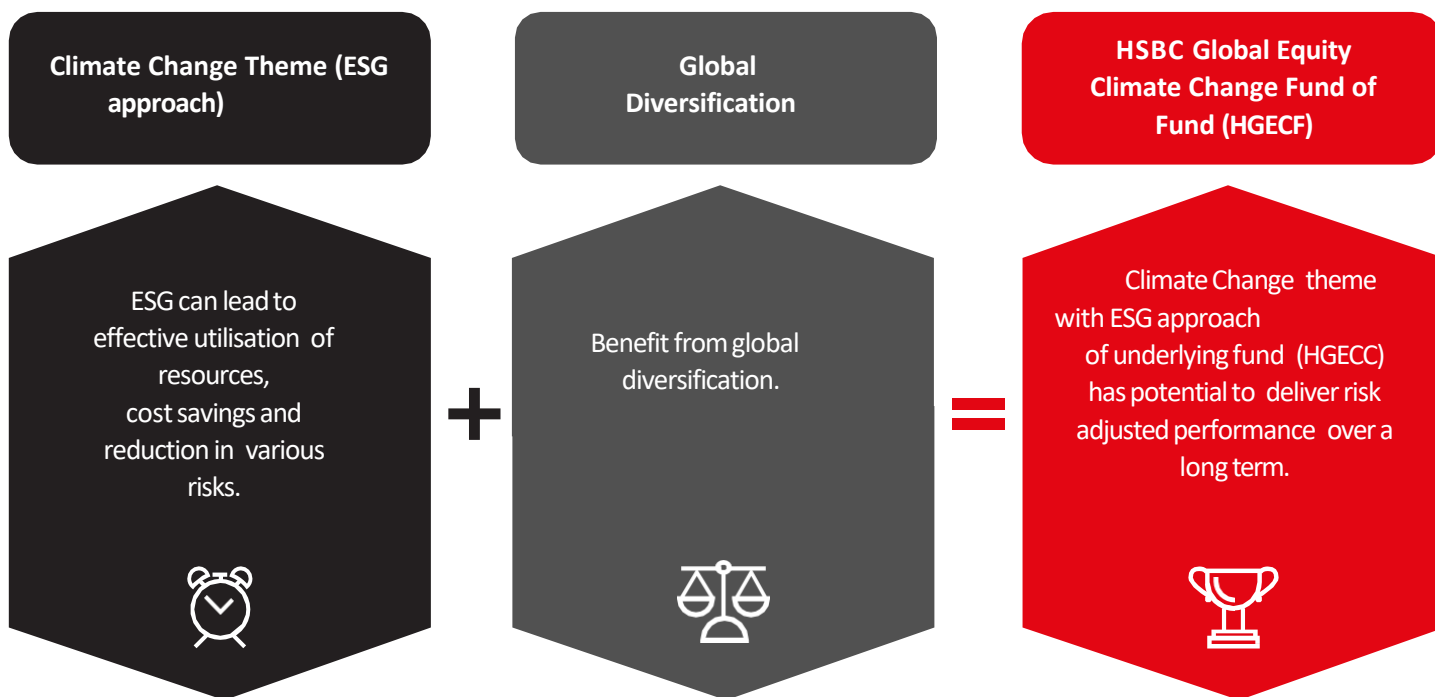

At sector level, stock selection was negative for the quarter. Positive performance came from Materials and Consumer Staples, though this was offset by negative stock selection in Information Technology and Utilities.

At country level, stock selection was negative for the quarter. Positive performance came from Taiwan and Ireland, though this was offset by negative stock selection in USA and United Kingdom.

USA Information Technology security, CADENCE DESIGN SYS INC with total effect 0.42% is the top contributor. Additionally, USA Industrials security, CORE & MAIN INC-CLASS A was the second largest contributor with total effect 0.22%. USA Materials security, SMURFIT WESTROCK PLC also contributed with total effect 0.20%.

On the other side, detractors included Spanish Utilities security EDP RENOVAVEIS SA with total effect -0.92%, USA Information Technology holding, FIRST SOLAR INC with total effect -0.86%, and USA Consumer Discretionary holding, TESLA INC with total effect -0.51%.

During this period, positions were initiated in CORE & MAIN INC-CLASS A, XYLEM INC, COPART INC, ARCADIS NV, and ASM INTERNATIONAL NV.

Positions were closed in ASML HOLDING NV, SENSATA TECHNOLOGIES HOLDING, VEOLIA ENVIRONNEMENT, ENPHASE ENERGY INC, and SYENSQO SA.

Sector and Country allocation effects are residual to stock selection. At a country level, effects were negative, given an underweight exposure to USA. At sector level, effects were negative, given an underweight exposure to Industrials.
